### PARISH NEWSLETTER 29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, 21ST OCTOBER 2018

Growing up in Ireland the mission of the church was about Priests and Nuns bringing the gospel to people in faraway lands. At home the laity's work was ordinary and mundane and wasn't seen as mission. Church Mission today has a very different focus and meaning it is no longer the domain of the professional or religious, we are the people of God, part of his mystical body and we are all called to bring the Gospel good news, social mercy, assistance and support to others.

We all know families in our community that face formidable obstacles that are not of their own making. They are caught up in a spiral of disadvantage from which they find it difficult to break free no matter how hard they try. Others suffer abuse or mental torture accusing themselves of poor decision making or sin they can't break free of or forgive themselves - don't know how to ask for help or forgiveness. They often blame themselves for breaking some commandment or a church law and fear being judged or condemned, they are super vigilant in keeping their painful secrets to themselves and from others.

Many people in our society suffer from poverty that not only affects them economically but also inhibits them from coping with life. Others suddenly burdened or stricken for one reason or another: the unemployed worker or single parent struggling with harsh systems that is difficult to access. The illegal immigrant and those overwhelmed by debt, evicted by their landlord and living on the street or in overcrowded emergency motel rooms or garages.

Poverty also encompasses a multiple of losses and anxieties that people struggle with; grief, physical and mental illness, depression, loneliness and misery, feelings of brokenness, poor health, despair, bereavement, shame, self-doubt depression, fear, anger, self-revulsion, blame and pain ordinary loneliness and misery.

Pope Francis has called for a "revelation of tenderness" in our world. To be more Christ like in our interaction with others, standing in solitary with others, advocating and working for justice helping others find a road to mercy.

Mission Sunday is a reminder that we are all called to mission — working in partnership, using our gifts and talents to help others less fortunate and in need of help. Whether we work in some far away mission field or work in our community doing the ordinary or mundane doesn't matter. It's about giving a cup of cold water, reaching a towel and/or washing feet.
