Living Wage Week 4-11 November 2018
This week we reflect on the fact that for over 125 years the Catholic Church has supported the need for a just wage sufficient to adequately provide for a worker's family. In July 2016 Bishop Pat gave his support to the Living Wage movement that has in recent years been so successful in raising the wages of low paid workers. Of the 285,000 children living in poverty in New Zealand, 40% come from families where at least one adult is in full time work or self-employed. As Parishioners we can look to ways to encourage employers to pay their workers the Living Wage which as Bishop Pat puts so well is a way of enabling families "to support themselves to live life with a modicum of respectability and not just be on the bread line."

Advent Prayer, A Parish Event for all in the Parish
A time of Prayer and Preparation, silence and Stillness.

How will you prepare for Christmas this year? How many Advents have you heard it said, maybe even a voice within you saying "I need to slow down and prepare spiritually for Christmas". This year the parish is giving us an opportunity to do just that in a very real way with the Advent prayer series.

The Taize-style prayer for Advent at St Anne's this year has its humble beginnings in the Saturday night prayer time of the annual RCIA retreat at Waipuna Marae, Hokianga. Everyone gathered round at the end of the day...scripture, prayer, chant and silence...

"Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy...from the anxieties of daily life".
"Prepare the way of the Lord".
"He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire".
"Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled".

Are you open to the opportunity? No qualifications or experience required. You don't even have to be Catholic. Just come as you are and let God Come...open the door of your heart and soul to God...What have you got to lose?...lose yourself in me and you will find new life...". Afraid?... "be not afraid for I am with you always". Don't feel holy enough?... "come as you are".

If those in RCIA, Catholics and non-Catholics, young and old, all on the journey, can humbly come together before the Lord to share scripture, prayer, chant and silence...why can't we as a parish do that in a special way during this Advent season?

Let us prepare well for Christmas this year, in our Parish this opportunity as a Parish event is for all, and it is for the four weeks of Advent, it is on Thursday Night at eight.
