To Listen is one of the easiest things to do.

To listen with Love is one of the hardest things to do. Married people will testify to this.

Listening is easy — or hearing is easy. When we listen with our heart switched on to the others it requires a big act of love.

That's why "faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ" (Romans 10:17). If we don't hear God, how can our faith grow? We are called to hear God's Word with Love.

Please wait at the doors if you are late for Mass.
