

## A message from Fr Brian

Extraordinary times in the world, and today.

We come with the opportunity to gather for Mass.

The Church is open to all without any restriction on numbers. Daily Mass schedule will return with the timetables listed, however we are looking once again and enabling the most suitable times for the majority of people and the ability to have small domestic church Masses is still a possibility.

As a parish with the discussion of the Liturgy Committee and the Parish council, we will gently return to some normal way of operating. For the next few Sundays of this month the following will stay in place:

- Use of hand sanitiser at the doors of the church, entry only through the main doors.
- No holy water available until a future date, but you are able to take holy water home with your own bottles from the urn near the baptismal font.
- Communion under the form of Bread and only on the hand.
- Very low-key musical accompaniment because we have not scheduled and organised this aspect. We are aiming for the start of July.
- During Mass, you can make the Sign of Peace at your discretion but there is no insistence that has to happen. It's more important we acknowledge those who are sitting around us.

Many people are not comfortable about coming back into a large group. That is okay, there are many opportunities to worship God and care for each other. Daily Mass may suit you. The ability to gather in smaller groups may be helpful at this time.

We hope to celebrate with the Parish on the 26th July St Anne's Day. Planning will be under way.
