

A message from Fr Brian

A people's spirit wounded,
dishonoured,
and diminished.
Their land stolen,
their leaders killed,
their people enslaved,
their children starved.

Remembering the spirit of their people's resistance they will, nevertheless, endure. Our phrase never gives in: never give up our faith - is always true. The most dangerous and insidious tactic of an imposer is the attempt to destroy the people's spirit. Beliefs and practices that has held them together, create in the hearts of the young a restlessness for change and diversion. Make people conform to outside influences impose values that are not your own, create doubt where you come from, and all before has led you to disaster. Give opportunities for mindless pleasure and distraction, virtual worlds of make believe, create false hopes and aspirations. All lead to a dulling and diminishing of spirit.

Psychologists insist that the failure to know who you are leads to madness, suicide, or violent rage. It is psychic death. The Gospel says it in another fear those that can destroy the soul, the heart of the person, the very inner soul. There is great activity in the efforts to destroy the soul. We are moving towards two big decisions that a weak parliament have asked the people of this land to cast their opinion. In a land that already has horrific consequences around alcohol, we legalize another drug of recreation. And in a country that already has a way of doing away with our unborn we look for another as well -the infirm and weak.

As for me and my house we choose life. Exodus. *"See, I set before you today life and prosperity, death and destruction. For I command you today to love the Lord your God, to walk in obedience to him, and to keep his commands, decrees and laws; then you will live and increase, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land you are entering to possess."* -Deuteronomy 30:16

Questions for Reflection

From livingtheword.org.nz - A Marist Resource. You could discuss these in your families

1st Reading: Jeremiah 20: 10-13

Jeremiah expresses total confidence that the Lord will protect him even though he is in a volatile situation where even his one-time friends are out to trip him up.

Have you ever felt trapped and surrounded by difficulties out of your control? How did you relate with God through that time?

How hard is it for you to 'trust your cause' to God like Jeremiah? What do you need to be able to move from knowledge about faith, to faith in a warm, honest, deep relationship in which you experience the love, power, mercy and justice of God?

2nd Reading: Romans 5: 12-15

Paul explains why the revelation of Jesus means God can be fully trusted. Because he put his love on the line by sending Jesus to rescue us when we were trapped in sin and separated from God.

What aspect of your life do you struggle the most with? Ask Jesus to give you the grace you need to be set free in that area today.

Gospel: Matthew 10: 26-33

Jesus tells us to "fear no one". Jesus asks us to recognise our true worth - that we are so precious to God that every hair on our head has been counted and even a sparrow is known to God.

What does the imagery tell you about how attentive God is to you?

Did you know how much God values you?

How do you feel knowing that Jesus speaks up for you and your needs?

What opportunities to share God's love can you take this week?

The word 'fear' appears 92 times in the New Testament. God knows our human tendency to be afraid and wants to encourage us. "Consult not your fears, but your hopes and your dreams. Think not about your frustrations, but about your unfulfilled potential. Concern yourself not with what you tried and failed in, but with what it is still possible for you to do" - Pope St. John XXIII .

How does knowing your true worth help you do that?
