BE LIKE PETER & PAUL

Free but Humble

In his homily for the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29th, Pope Francis reflected: "Peter and Paul were free because they were set free."


Peter, the fisherman from Galilee, was set free above all from his sense of inadequacy and his bitter experience of failure thanks to the unconditional love of Jesus. Peter, a skilled fisherman, often thought of giving up when he saw that he would catch nothing. He tasted fear. Albeit a fervent disciple of the Lord, he continued to think by worldly standards, and thus failed to understand and accept the meaning of Christ's cross.



We too have been touched by the Lord; we too have been set free. Yet we need to be set free time and time again, for only a free Church is a credible Church. Peter and Paul bequeath to us the image of a Church entrusted to our hands, yet guided by the Lord with fidelity and tender love. This is a Church that is weak, yet finds strength in the presence of God. A Church set free and capable of offering the world the freedom that the world by itself cannot give: freedom from sin and death, from resignation, and from the sense of injustice and the loss of hope that dehumanizes the lives of the women and men of our time.

Even after saying that he was ready to give his life for Jesus, the mere suspicion that he was one of Christ's disciples led him in fright to deny the Master. But nonetheless, Jesus loved Peter and was willing to take a risk on him. He encouraged Peter not to give up and gave him the courage to risk everything and the joy of becoming a fisher of men. It was Peter whom Jesus called to strengthen his brothers in faith. All that was possible only because Peter himself had been set free.

Paul, too, experienced the freedom brought by Christ. He was set free from the most oppressive form of slavery, which is slavery to self. He was also set free from the religious fervour that had made him a zealous defender of his ancestral traditions and a cruel persecutor of Christians.



God, however, did not spare him the frailties and hardships that rendered his mission of evangelization more fruitful, and Paul thus came to realize that God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong.

The Church looks to these two giants of faith and sees two Apostles who set free the power of the Gospel in our world, only because first, they themselves had been set free by their encounter with Christ. They were neither judged nor humiliated by Jesus, who instead shared their life with affection and closeness. He does the same with us.

It is in giving his life that the shepherd, himself set free, becomes a means of bringing freedom to his brothers and sisters. We pray for all Pastors, for the Church, and for all of us: that, set free by Christ, we may be apostles of freedom throughout the world.

JESUS "MARVELED BECAUSE OF THEIR UNBELIEF"

SUNDAY READINGS

Mark
6:1-6

For Jesus, this was not just a typical or passing thought, "wow, these people don't believe the truth when they hear it." He was astounded and grieved that they would remain in their sin and continue under the ill-conceived oversight of selfish leaders. He cared, and out of that care came his astonishment. The people of Nazareth enjoyed so many advantages. Jesus lived among them.

He preached to them with power. They knew of His miracles. But they were blind to his identity, deaf to his message and hardened their hearts against Him, to their own peril and loss.

Jesus is not physically here on earth today. But His people are here and His message is sounded forth. Human responses often duplicate that of the people of Nazareth - stubborn unbelief. We may, at times, have doubt like Peter; but Jesus can work with doubt. Pure refusal to believe however, is another story.


