Kneeling after the "Lamb of God"

If you have a Mass book you might have seen the instruction "Kneel" that comes after the "Lamb of God". Then follows the priest's prayer "Behold the Lamb of God..." with the people's response "Lord I am not worthy..."

Here at St Anne's, however, we keep standing. I propose that we now observe that instruction to kneel at the end of the "Lamb of God". It is deeply good and right. It would also bring us into line with other NZ parishes.

Poor Health - Exemption

Of course, if your health is not good you are exempted. So please be seated. (Poor health overrides most Church disciplines – like fasting or even attending Sunday Mass.)

"Old Fashioned"?

Perhaps you have heard kneeling criticised as being 'medieval' or 'old fashioned'.

A little background might be helpful. Kneeling is much older than 'medieval' and far more solemn than 'fashion'. It is a gesture all through the Bible which is reserved for being in the presence of

God - and only God. This makes it a posture of prayer.

It is deeply biblical and Christian.

Jesus at Gethsemane "withdrew about a stone's throw away and knelt down and prayed, 'Father...' (Lk 22:41).

Many people knelt before Jesus in faith, eg a leper (Mk1:40) "came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees saying..." When Jesus entered the boat having walked on water "the men in the boat fell at his feet saying...." (Mt 14:33). One suffering from epilepsy "went down in his knees before Jesus" (Mt 17:14). There are many other examples.



Ev'ry Knee Shall Bow..."

We know well the song "He is Lord, He is Lord... Ev'ry knee shall bow, ev'ry tongue confess..." It is a paraphrase of St Paul to the Philippians (2:6-11) "Therefore God... bestowed on him (Jesus) the name which is above every name (that is: God's name) that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth; and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord...". To go down on our knees before Jesus, is to co-operate with God's plan.

At every Mass we fulfil this prophecy – in this physical way. Together with the prayer of our lips, may we profess with our whole being that Jesus truly is Lord.



First 'Local Boy' Priest - Leonard Danvers

Our school was small in those early days and one memory was that we were going to be inspected by the Government Inspectors. The curtains in our Room were wearing very thin – in fact had holes in a number of places. Sister Helena decided we needed to do something about them before the inspectors arrived. So we were all invited to bring oddments of material and cut out jungle figures and trees etc to cover the holes in the curtains. They were certainly very colourful at the end of the project and drew many comments not only from parents but also from the inspectors. The curtains lasted a few more

years as a result!

The moving truck took the big items but the older Children from the school formed a chain gang and carried all manner of items including garden tools and boxes of preserves down to the new home – it was a great day off school, and we had a great time.

Sister's Feast Day was another special day. We would be allowed into the classroom early that morning and would decorate the whole blackboard in colour chalk drawings with all sorts of messages and special prayers for Sister on her



special day. It was most colourful. And of course the children insisted that it could not be rubbed off all day! So we amused ourselves with other activities which were far more fun than formal lessons – and there was always a huge morning tea and Feast day cake.

Genesis starts with a creation narrative and then tells the early history of humanity—but how does Genesis connect Christians with other faith traditions and world views?




