

This year we need to re-found our parish pastoral council. Its role, however, is challenging: to **research, reflect, and recommend** a way ahead on pastoral matters. These "Three R's" are dotted through the diocesan handbook for parish pastoral councils. See the Bulletin 30 April on the website for this method applied to the RCIA.

Macro to Micro

These "Three 'R's" originate from the Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) which is the model (in macro) for parish pastoral councils. The DPC advises the Bishop on *diocesan* pastoral matters. Similarly the PPC is an advisory body to the priests on pastoral matters at parish level. In fact most parish structures are micro versions of diocesan structures. For example, the diocesan admin in Ponsonby is the model for our much smaller parish office at St Anne's. Similarly the Diocesan Finance Committee is the model for every Parish FC. In the same way, parish pastoral councils take their structure from the DPC.

Is a Pastoral Council like a School Board of Trustees? Not really...

A Board of Trustees is a widely understood governance committee. They hire and appoint a principal to their school. That principal answers to the Board. By contrast it is the Bishop who appoints the parish priest and assistant priests to a parish. The priests can work there only with his approval, and clearly they answer to him, not to the pastoral council. The bishop keeps overall responsibility. The priests just 'stand in' for him. Therefore, the pastoral council (and all the other committees for that matter) are to help the priests who must answer to the bishop.

Synodal

This way of working is particular to the church - called synodal. It has its challenges - it can be slow. But the results are positive and worthwhile. It works.



People who Know Our People

'A community of communities' is how Pope Francis describes a parish. Hopefully councillors will be good at **researching, reflecting on and recommending** more good workers for this Manurewa vineyard of the Lord. I do hope so. The harvest is great!



"The one who sings, prays twice" -- these words attributed to St Augustine..... and indeed, there is a whole chorus of prayer raised each Sunday at Masses here in St Anne's, enough to raise the rafters! Particularly at the 10 am Mass which I regularly attend. I acknowledge that musicians are there for all Masses Sat/Sun - and aware that on some weekends it is a double-shift for some! A great gift to us.

As a Parish we are indeed fortunate and gifted with so many talented musicians and choir members giving generously of their time.... and the best result is that the whole congregation

wholeheartedly join in - I have not experienced same elsewhere.... congratulations and thanks to all involved. A special joy was to hear and see the young cantor TJ Gafoi on

Pentecost Sunday - brother of keyboard player Gary. In the early days Sister Cecelia, teacher of piano at the convent, also played the organ and gathered together choir members, particularly those whom she had taught in primary school. The organ I recall in those days was pedal-powered not electric!!

Miss Monica Naughton took over as organist and Jack McMillan helped with choir practice and formation. Mrs Pat Moverley followed as organist and for many years trained the choir (Latin Masses in those days) then led us into the new hymns, leaving "Faith of Our Fathers" and "Adeste Fidelis" behind in favour of "This is My Commandment". New hymn books, no overhead transparencies (pre-technology of today). But we had Father Sakey greatly encouraging congregational participation, by walking up and down the aisle leading the singing in his strong voice. Pat Moverley, also a teacher at St Anne's encouraged and monitored several young teens to play the organ - Frances Leo, Rosemarie Leilua, Leeanne Winkley, Eileen Gibson, Vera Baptist and Gabriel Moverley names we recall.

Rose Lamont remembers it was very nerve-wracking playing the organ at old St Anne's as the organ was located at front of the church to the left of the lectern, so you couldn't really hide! We didn't have cantors back then so had to rely on the parishioners to lead the singing.

A new 'Baldwin 504' organ purchased 1982 after tremendous fundraising, Bernadette Foster organist and advisor....guitars, clarinets and other instruments also became part of our music groups.
