POWER, HONOUR AND GLORY IS IN SERVING

Mark 10:35-45

Today, James and John (the sons of thunder) request the seats of honour with Jesus in heaven. They and the other ten want to be **"big time"** but do not understand that honour and glory come only through suffering. The **"big time comes through suffering,"** He tells them so, and that to sit at the right or left of Jesus in heaven is just not on. It is the Father who decides that.

So James and John don't get what they want. The other ten are really annoyed because James and John have beaten them to what they were all thinking and wanting. Ha ha!

Jesus is so wise. He sees that they have got it all wrong. Service and sacrifice are what is important, not unmerited honours and vain glory. So Jesus prepares the Twelve for leadership in the emerging Christian community.

"Whoever wants to be the greatest among you must make himself the servant of all, and whoever wants to be first must make himself the slave of all."

Jesus denounces ambition and vain glory, seeking to be above others, to be well regarded by others, to be served by others.

The best example is Jesus, servant of all.

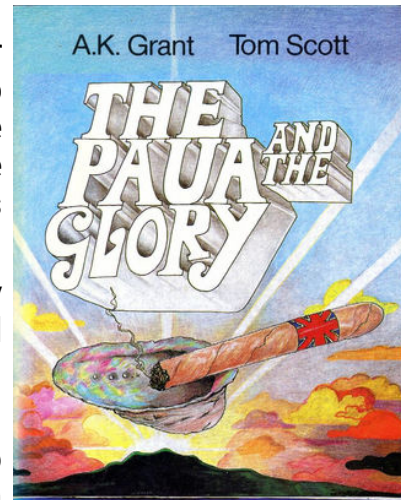
As a parent, a school kid, a boss at work, a leader in a community or in a movement. We are not so because we are above others and that people must bow before us. Rather because **we have committed to serve**. We are not at the top but at the bottom.

To humbly serve implies that below we seek initiatives, creativity, knowledge and efforts to build a human, just and world of solidarity, but never as a tyrant, a bully or a dictator. Rather, gently and patiently at the back, not the front, at the bottom, not at the top.

Our **attitude** must be that we consider ourselves the least, the last and the servant of all.

"Know that the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

BLESSED PAULINE JARICOT

The initial inspiration behind **Mission Sunday**.

Born 1799 in Lyon, France. At 19 she established a penny collection among her father's employees.

This became the **Association for the Propagation of the Faith** in 1822 and would spread throughout the world.

Pauline realized that for people to pray for **MISSION** and support missionaries, they needed to know the real challenges missionaries face. So she began a magazine about it.

Around 1823, Pauline met the founder of the Marist Fathers Jean Claude Colin. The Marist Fathers with Bishop Pompallier were the first missionaries to Western Oceania, New Zealand included.

We owe a great debt of gratitude to Blessed Pauline Jaricot and the Propagation of the Faith which supported the infant church in New Zealand and the Islands of the Pacific.

Mission Sunday 2024 is celebrated on Sunday 20 October. Donations are collected at these worldwide Masses and they go, in their entirety, to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor.

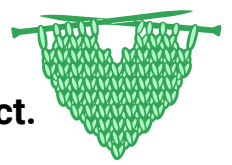
LEGION OF MARY
